

MESSIANIC PROPHECY— PSALMS PART TWO

Psalm 110

"A Psalm of David. The LORD says to my Lord: "Sit at My right hand Until I make Your enemies a footstool for Your feet." 2 The LORD will stretch forth Your strong scepter from Zion, saying, "Rule in the midst of Your enemies." 3 Your people will volunteer freely in the day of Your power; In holy array, from the womb of the dawn, Your youth are to You as the dew. 4 The LORD has sworn and will not change His mind, "You are a priest forever According to the order of Melchizedek." 5 The Lord is at Your right hand; He will shatter kings in the day of His wrath. 6 He will judge among the nations, He will fill them with corpses, He will shatter the chief men over a broad country. 7 He will drink from the brook by the wayside; Therefore He will lift up His head." (110:1-7 NASB)

- The Messiah would be a king who rules (v.2)
- The Messiah would be an eternal priest according to the order of Melchizedek (Gen 14:19-20; Heb 7:1-28)
- The Messiah would be God-Man sitting at the right hand of God (Matthew 22:42-46)
- The Messiah would have a time of waiting before He ruled ("until" v. 1)

Psalm 118:22-26

"The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief corner *stone*. This is the LORD'S doing; It is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day which the LORD has made; Let us rejoice and be glad in it." O LORD, do save, we beseech You; O LORD, we beseech You, do send prosperity! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD; We have blessed you from the house of the LORD."

- The Messiah would be rejected (Mark 12:1-12; Romans 9:32-33)
- The Messiah would be the chief cornerstone of God's plan (Luke 20:17-20; Acts 4:10-12; 1 Peter 2:4-8)
- The Messiah would come in the name of the LORD (Matthew 21:9, 15; 23:39; John 12:13)

Psalm 69

"Those who hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; Those who would destroy me are powerful, being wrongfully my enemies;" (Psa 69:4)

"For zeal for Your house has consumed me, And the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me." (Psa 69:9)

"They also gave me gall for my food And for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink." (Psa 69:21)

"May their camp be desolate; May none dwell in their tents." (Psa 69:25)

- The Messiah would be hated without a cause (John 15:25)
- The Messiah would be reproached with the reproaches of the Lord (Romans 15:3)
- The Messiah would be consumed with zeal (John 2:17 after Jesus cleansed the temple)
- The Messiah would be given gall and vinegar to drink (Matt 27:48; John 19:28-29)
- The Messiah's betrayer would be left desolate (Acts 1:20)

Psalm 109

" Appoint a wicked man over him, And let an accuser stand at his right hand. 7 When he is judged, let him come forth guilty, And let his prayer become sin. 8 Let his days be few; Let another take his office. 9 Let his children be fatherless And his wife a widow. 10 Let his children wander about and beg; And let them seek *sustenance* far from their ruined homes. 11 Let the creditor seize all that he has, And let strangers plunder the product of his labor. 12 Let there be none to extend lovingkindness to him, Nor any to be gracious to his fatherless children. 13 Let his posterity be cut off; In a following generation let their name be blotted out. 14 Let the iniquity of his fathers be remembered before the LORD, And do not let the sin of his mother be blotted out. " (Psalm 109:6-14)

- The Messiah's betrayer would have his office taken and be cursed (Acts 1:16; Matt 26:24-25)
